Wednesday, September 9th, we had a band, Copper Ridge, filling in for Taska, who was originally scheduled and unable to play. This is a letter received from the band that night...

Thanks for having us out to play tonight. Despite the negativity out of a few of the people there, we did still have some fun & we had plenty of dancers right up until the last song.

However, we need to cancel the gig for December 9th, as it is just not a fit for our band. I must say, I have never once played music (anywhere) and gotten that level of rudeness from anyone in the crowd. We're better suited for the types of gigs we normally play: where people want the more upbeat music and we don't have to turn the volume down on stage so low to where it is uncomfortable for the lead singers.

One of the officers came up and asked us to turn back up a little because they couldn't hear us by the bar- he was very nice and apologetic for the people who were rude, and we had several very nice people come up and talk to us. But again, I think the venue is simply not a fit for us. A few bad apples really can spoil the enjoyment. I did tell Harlan to maybe get with you about one of the groups he plays with covering the December date.

Again, thanks for the opportunity, we did have fun! Best wishes to you. =)

Here is a letter received from a member who was present that night...

I have never seen so many rude Eagle members in all of my 35 years as a proud Eagle member. It almost made me ashamed to be an Eagle member. Wed. night the secretary was at the bar trying to relax and have a drink and enjoy the music. Several members started yelling at the secretary about the band that was originally scheduled was not there. An Eagle member even told the band they sucked If you have a complaint come to the meeting and voice your complaint there. That is the only place they will be dealt with. Better still, come down to the lodge and have lunch, or dinner and a drink. Drinking free water does not help lodge finances.

Brothers and Sisters, it is NEVER okay to go up to the band and tell them the music is too loud, too quiet, etc. You MUST go talk to a Trustee, or in absence of a Trustee, the bartender. May I simply suggest : If it is too loud, find a seat further away from the speakers. If it is not loud enough, move closer.

Also, it is NEVER okay to be rude to our Volunteers, including those who schedule music. Ann DID NOT deserve to be ridiculed for scheduling this band or for that matter, any other band. There were plenty of people on the dance floor and many who stayed up until the last song.

I am extremely embarrassed that Eagle members would act this way. This is not the impression we should leave with an outside band. And, this is not the way we should treat fellow Eagles. Most of your events are coordinated by VOLUNTEERS. Please consider that every event we schedule we hope that you will enjoy, although we know we will not please everyone all the time.

The negativity towards music and events that are put on are enough to cause our volunteers to stop helping out. Like the letter says, one bad apple can spoil the bunch. Why are we so quick to complain and so slow to appreciate and say THANK YOU? Brothers and Sisters, without our VOLUNTEERS, we would not have events going on here. PLEASE REMEMBER THE IMPORTANCE OF A THANK YOU. Sadly, all it takes is one negative comment delivered wrongly to destroy it all. Please consider your words and consider the effect those words will have. May I suggest that if you do not want to be part of the solution, stop being a part of the problem. We cannot afford to lose our volunteers. I feel like throwing in the towel at times, but I love this place too much to do that. However, it is not okay for some of these behaviors to continue. This behavior is unbecoming of an Eagle and you will be referred to the Trustees. ("I'm Sorry" also goes a long way. Please consider apologizing for your behavior if you were one of the ones involved.)
