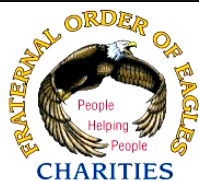
Baby Shower in March

A Message from the Aerie Worthy Secretary: Ann Madsen

The 2015 -2016 Aerie membership dues are coming up due April 30, 2015. By high demand we will be sending out by mail a notice to pay your dues and an envelope to send back your payment back. You may have already received the dues notice. You can use your debit card or credit card to pay your dues. There is a fee of \$3.50 if you use your card. There is an early bird incentive to get your dues in by March 31. You will receive an early bird drink ticket. Those that were initiated at the \$30 per year will receive notices later. We are hoping by mailing back the envelope or putting the envelope in the secretary mail box on the wall, that this will take the high demand off the bartenders to take membership dues at the bar. Many of you may not know but I have a full time job and will not be in the office to take membership dues. There is a form for you to fill out to update our records. Under the Grand Aerie Constitution and Statutes Section 71.10 Every member shall notify the Secretary, at once, of any change in his residence or

mailing address, and notice sent to the last address furnished to the Secretary shall be deemed to be the proper and legal notice.

We are hoping that many of you will start using your emails for the Eagle Beak. It's very expensive to print and mail out. The cost is around \$500.00 per month to print and send. Total per year \$6,000.00. The other great thing about using the internet is Facebook. Yes, Willamette Eagles 2081 has a Facebook site. We send out e-blasts about upcoming events at the lodge. See picture of events that have been held at the lodge.

I would like at this time to explain to you how your membership dues work by the Grand Aerie Constitution and Statutes. Many think that the dues money goes to the lodge, to put on the events, pay bills and maintenance which is not true and cannot be handled in this manner. Membership dues goes into the "Benefit Savings account" (Section 111.1, I'll list a few of the items the money goes too.) which pays for Grand Aerie and State/Provincial per capita tax, approximately \$8,000.00 per year (depends on how many members we have). To pay all the State and Federal Withholding Tax payments which have been deducted or withheld from employees' compensation. All employees Social Security and unemployment Compensation payments or withheld from employee compensation. Basically our hands are tied when it comes to the membership dues by Grand Aerie.

These next saving accounts is for income that we generate. The General Savings Account and the Social Saving Account which we as the members have combined as one is where we put the incoming income. What we make off of the kitchen, bar, raffle, events, rental of the lodge to members and the public, BINGO, etc...

Keizer Fund Account is the account that we put the payments made by the leasee of the Keizer Lodge to make the loan payment.

Building Maintenance Fund Account is money that has been donated by members to help with maintenance such as light bulbs, paint, basic minor repairs, steam cleaning the commercial hoods in the kitchen. Donation drives for larger maintenance projects such as re-roofing, new carpet new commercial kitchen equipment.

Lottery Account Funds which is the account that we have to pay Lottery out of.

I hope this helps you understand better what your membership dues are used for. I will post the Grand Aerie Constitution and Statutes for this section on the bulletin board.

I would like to see more members at our Tuesday meeting the at 7 pm. The first and third Tuesday of the month. If you don't come you must be very happy on what is going on in the lodge and have no complaints. Which I can't really believe.

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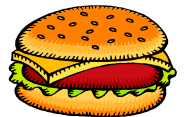
